#### Introduction

To the members of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on your continued support and success of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department during the 2020 year. In 2020, the make-up of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission changed slightly with the replacement of a representative from Tunkhannock Township. Commission member Juan Adams resigned as a Tunkhannock Township representative and was replaced by Crayson Cheung. The current police commission representation has been a pleasure to work with. Their oversight and experience makes for an effective working group in the oversight of the communities police service. This working group, coupled with trained and professional police personnel results in a level of police service that is lauded throughout our communities and recognized state wide.

2020 was certainly a challenging year. As with all of our municipalities, businesses, schools, social activities and life as usual was disrupted by the Covid-19 pandemic, the regional department was affected the same, but also different. While most of our society went through a lock-down through quarantine and isolation, the regional department continued with 24 hours a day, 365 days per year, services. Our men and women in blue and support staff continued to report to work to ensure that overall public safety services were available when called upon. While our staff held the line through the pandemic, we also, administratively, worked diligently to ensure that our operation was maintained in the safest manner possible following the Center for Disease Control guidance and recommendations.

To this end, the department went through various phases whereby we closed our front vestibule for walk-in services, opting for phone only services for secretarial processes and walk in complaints. We also restricted proactive patrol operations to limit face to face contacts. Restrictions were also put into place regarding certain complaint responses and how those responses would be altered to maximize social distancing and avoid contagion. Various other operations mitigation strategies were utilized to maximize the departments ability to maintain public safety while balancing the safety of officers and staff. Officers and staff were provided with various personal protective equipment, while the office building and patrol vehicles were fumigated on multiple occasions. Additionally, we increased the frequency of general cleaning services.

In 2020, our staffing fluctuated as seems to be common within the industry. The department had 2 resignations and 2 retirements and hired 4 new officers. As we've witnessed in the last couple of years, hiring and retention have been challenging, but we continue to be proactive in our retention efforts and continue to hold our high standards and expectations for new hires. 2020 did experience a decrease in the number of applicants from 2019. Additionally, the effect of the Covid-19 pandemic put the hiring process on hold, while schools and other facilities, necessary in the hiring process, were closed to outside organizations. This created a situation where, by the time the process was re-instituted, many applicants failed to continue in the process. The end result showed available applicant numbers that were very low. Police service hours remained the same in 2020 from 2019, although Mount Pocono Borough reduced by 3.5 hours per week while Tobyhanna Township picked up those hours.

The Regional Department also promoted two officers. Detective Corporal Lucas Bray was promoted to Detective Sergeant and Officer Derek Chaffee was promoted to Patrol Corporal. There were five lateral transfers. Patrol Corporal Robert Miller was transferred to the criminal investigations division as a Detective Corporal, Officers Donald Scarfo and Erica Burk were transferred to the criminal investigations division as Detectives, Officer Jeffrey Lutz was transferred from patrol to the school resource officer position (SRO) while SRO William Carey was transferred to the patrol division. The department also hired 4 new officers to the staff. Officers Ashley Rzeszewski, Michael Parrent, Zachary Scheetz, Corey Kime were brought on board.

When looking at significant statistics of the year and taking into account the effect of the pandemic, the department actually experienced an increase in call volume of 2.4%. Additionally, the regional department, for 3 consecutive years, received the most dispatches from the Monroe County Control Center. This gives us a good indication that our communities continue to demand elevated services as compared to other areas within the county. Due to travel restriction and a significant decrease in public travel, the department noted a drop in motor vehicle accidents of 16%. With the decrease in traffic and a restriction on proactive patrol, the department also witnessed a drop in traffic citations of 47%.

As for criminal activity, the department saw a drop in criminal arrests at 13%. Reported crimes were noted to continue in annual trends. Type 1 UCR's or our serious crime, continued a 5 year decline. Type 2 UCR, or our petty crime, continued a slow 5 year climb.

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to meet the needs of our municipalities through hiring, training, and deploying the best and brightest that our communities have to offer. Our officers remain motivated and seek time tested and innovative solutions to community problems. With the pandemic, our officers had less of a chance to truly interact with our communities. Many events were cancelled that have historically allowed a great deal of police

and community interactions. This not only included community and business events, but also working with our students within the physical school facilities. Overall, our goals and mission have not changed. The Officers of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police strive to maintaining law, order and safe highways for our residents and visitors. We strive to ensure safe communities that will foster a better quality of life and nurture growth in our businesses. Respectively submitted:





#### **Sick Time:**

11 members of the PMRPD used no sick time during 2020. These Officers were: Lieutenants Steve Williams, Corporal Jeff Papi, Detectives Michael Sciarillo and Kyle VanNote, and Officers Richard Michaels, Scott Dunlap, Robert Ellis, Ashley Rzeszewski, Michael Parrent, Zachary Scheetz and Corey Kime.

The number of sick days taken during 2020 by all officers was 176 for an average of 3.8 days per officer. Sick time was up by 1.2% in 2020 as compared with 2019.

1 member of the PMRPD Non-Sworn staff used no sick time during 2020. This was Sue Kopp. The number of sick days taken for non-sworn employees was 37. The average number of sick days for the non-sworn members was 7.5 sick days per employee. This was down from 2019 by 35%.

#### **Training:**

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department strives to provide as much training as possible, given the responsibilities of a law enforcement organization, in relation to the budget allocation. In 2020, the Department budgeted \$32,000 towards training and \$25,000 towards tuition reimbursement. This training allocation is disbursed between department staff to keep up with the ever-increasing responsibilities of initial and continuing education.

All officers are required to attend the Municipal Police Officer Education and Training Commissions (MPOETC) mandatory updates, PMRPD firearms, less lethal, use of force, CPR, First Aid and mental health trainings. The department continues to transition to conducting mandatory MPOETC updates through the PAVTN (Pennsylvania Virtual Training Network) on-line. The on-line training has been determined to be more efficient for overall department operations. The department must also maintain required certifications and recertifications for departmental trainers. We also conduct mandatory in-house training requirements that take place throughout the year. 2020 was a challenging year for training, in that, the Covid-19 shut downs and mitigations strategies forced many training programs and seminars to postpone or cancel training events. Given this, training opportunities were reduced during the 2020 calendar year. The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department received the following training for various officers during 2020:

## Pocono Mountain Regional Police Partnerships

#### Partnership:

#### 1) Pocono Mountain School District - School Resource Officer (SRO) Program

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department currently has 4 SRO's within the Pocono Mountain School District (PMSD). These Officers are currently positioned within 4 main buildings within the district and rotate on occasion.
- PMSD has reimbursed the PMRPD \$392,996.00 for the SRO program in 2020.
- PMSD has reimbursed the PMRPD \$5,342.46 for extra duty assignments.

#### 2) Drug Enforcement Administration Task Force

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continued its partnership with the DEA Task Force in 2020.
- Detective Michael Sciarillo continued as the PMRPD DEA task force representative
- The PMRPD has been reimbursed \$16,551.11 for overtime in 2020.
- The PMRPD has received \$0 in asset forfeiture during 2020.

#### 3) Monroe County Drug Task Force

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to participate in the Monroe County Drug Task Force (MCDTF).
- The MCDTF has reimbursed the PMRPD \$11,691.04 for overtime in 2020.

#### 4) Northeast Pennsylvania Counter Terrorism Task Force (NEPACTTF)

- The PMRPD continues to participate in the NEPACTTF
   The NEPACTTF has purchased various equipment and provided training for PMRPD SWAT Operations.
- The total cost for the equipment and/or training provided by the NEPACTTF for 2020 was \$ 11,823.45.

#### 5) Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation (PMRPF)

- The PMRPD continues to receive support through the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation. In 2020 the PMRPF purchased equipment for and reimbursed the department a total of \$62,543.56, (see pages 101 - 104).

#### Units of Service:

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police uses a unit of service concept whereby municipalities purchase a requested number of hours by unit. A unit of service is equal to 10 hours of service. This unit of service is known as a Police Protection Unit or PPU. The 2020 cost per PPU was \$41,566.90. Officers activity is tracked through the submission of their activity reports. Through the data obtained in these reports, time spent on police activity within our municipalities is broken down and applied to the number of hours requested. This activity is reflected and presented monthly at our police commission meetings.

In 1998, Governor Tom Ridge established the Pennsylvania regional counter terrorism task force system. The Pocono Mountain Regional Police have been active in the Northeast Pennsylvania Counter Terrorism Task Force (NEPACTTF) since the onset. In 2020, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to be an active participant in the NEPACTTF. The NEPACTTF is one of 9 Homeland security task force regions within Pennsylvania. The NEPACTTF provides all hazards planning for the 9 counties within the region. These counties include Monroe, Lehigh, Northampton, Carbon, Pike, Lackawanna, Luzern, Wayne and Susquehanna.

Chief Chris Wagner continues in his role as the Law Enforcement Committee Chairman of the NEPACTTF. The NEPACTTF is funded by grants through the Federal Emergency Management Agency and funneled through the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency. While federal grant funds continue to decrease, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police still benefits from participation in the organization. In 2020, the NEPACTTF provided the Pocono Mountain Regional Police with equipment and training for a total cost of \$11,823.
