#### Introduction

To the members of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission (PMRPC), I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on your continued support and success of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department during the 2021 year. In 2021, the make-up of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission changed slightly with the replacement of a representative from Coolbaugh Township. William Weimer replaced Lynn Kelly as a PMRPC representative in 2021. Additionally, in April, Mount Pocono Borough replaced representative Claudette Williams with Francis O'Boyle. The Mount Pocono representative change vacated the PMRPC secretary position, which had been held by representative Williams. This position was subsequently filled by Michael Penn, also representing Mount Pocono Borough.

The 2021 police commission was an efficient group and expressed their support for the officers and staff of the department through a challenging political and social climate. Several factors including Covid-19, events in Minneapolis MN., and political change at the federal level created an abundance of social and political division nationally, which effected law enforcement. This climate created an opportunity for reflection of the profession, along with how and why our systems and procedures operate the way they do. Through this professional evaluation, both inside professionals and civilian oversight experience was called upon to ensure that the PMRPD is operating to a level of best practices. This working group, coupled with trained and professional police personnel continued a level of police service that is lauded throughout our communities and recognized state-wide.

In 2021, we continued to operate in the Covid-19 environment. Covid-19 mitigation continued to influence and guide many law enforcement operations. Response and interaction protocols continued in a way that was not standard operating procedure. Patrol operations were, at times, limited to reactive enforcement. Proactive interaction was discouraged to limit viral transmission. Health among the officers and staff remained strong. Many officers were infected, but no serious cases resulted, and law enforcement operations were not significantly affected. Our officers and staff continued to report for duty and respond to emergencies within our communities. We continued to operate 24 hours a day, all 365 days of 2021.

Operationally, as in 2020, the department went through various phases whereby we closed our front vestibule for walk-in services, opting for phone only services for secretarial processes and walk in complaints. The proactive patrol operations were limited to avoid face to face contacts, thereby minimizing viral transmission. Restrictions were also put into place regarding certain complaint responses and how those responses would be altered to maximize social distancing and avoid contagion. Various other operational mitigation strategies were utilized to maximize the department's ability to maintain public safety while balancing the health and safety of officers and staff. Officers and staff continued to be provided with various personal protective equipment, while the office building and patrol vehicles were fumigated on multiple occasions. Additionally, we increased the frequency of general cleaning services.

In 2021, we continued to experience staffing fluctuations. These fluctuations continue a trend of instability in the industry. This instability is being experienced both locally and nationally. The department had 5 resignations and 1 retirement. The PMRPD hired 4 new officers and 2 part time support staff members. As mentioned in previous annual reports, 2021 continued to present difficult challenges in the hiring process. 2021 continued the trend of fewer applicants for sworn officers than previous years. Not only were applicant numbers low, but we experienced elevated failure rates on our written test. These two factors resulted in record low applicant numbers coming into the interview process. At the same time, requested police service increased in 2021 by 40 hours per week.

The Regional Department did not have any promotions or lateral transfers in 2021. The department's 4 new officers are Kent Werkheiser, Adam Covert, Martin Ksepka, and Officer Josh Soto. Officer Soto was rehired after his resignation in June.

When looking at significant statistics of the year and taking into account the lingering effect of the pandemic, the PMRPD continued the upward trend in call volume. This upward trend has continued this path since 2014. The call volume increase from 2020 to 2021 was 4.47%. Dispatches from the Monroe County Control Center showed that the PMRPD has received a county high number of dispatches for four consecutive years. By looking at the call volume in conjunction with dispatch data, we are able to recognize the amount of police service that is expected from our municipalities. In 2020, Covid restriction created lock downs and restrictions of public travel. As was expected, these restrictions translated into a reduction of motor vehicle crashes. With the lifting of restrictions in 2021, we saw motor vehicle crashes increase by 10.76%.

When looking at criminal enforcement, the department saw an increase in criminal arrests at 6.37%. Reported crimes continued previous annual trends. Type 1 UCR's or our serious crime, continued a 6-year decline. Type 2 UCR, or our petty crime, continued a 6-year climb.

When looking at hour utilization, the amount of time spent on criminal investigations remained even with 2020 hours. Due to covid restriction lifting, patrol hours climbed from the hours recorded in 2020. Training hours dropped in 2021, as training events and organizations remained chilled due to lingering effects on venues and travel, due to restrictions.

Overall, as with our communities in general, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police have been slowly getting back to pre-pandemic operations. Call volume, accidents, criminal and traffic enforcement have all increased from 2020 numbers. These numbers indicate that our community has a need and expects increased law enforcement services. At the same time, social and political events have challenged hiring and retention not only nationally, but locally. The department continues to strive to match emergency service demand with qualified applicants and personnel.

The officers within PMRPD continue to provide services with an underlying foundation of best practices. This is accomplished through our continual application of Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission standards. Our officers remain motivated and have continued to serve and protect even through the uncertain events that were witnessed in 2020 and 2021. With the lifting of covid restriction, we look forward to resuming a solid base of police and public interaction and strong community related police interactions. Our goals and mission remain the same, we strive to maintain law, order and safe highways for our residents and visitors. 



#### **Sick Time:**

6 members of the PMRPD used no sick time during 2021. These Officers were: Lieutenants Steve Williams, Sergeant Charles LaRue, Sergeant David Posluszny, Officer Richard Michaels, Officer Corey Kime, and Officer Zachary Scheetz.

The number of sick days taken during 2021 by all officers was 139 for an average of 3.2 days per officer. Sick time was up by 21% in 2021 as compared with 2020.

The number of sick days taken for non-sworn employees was 32. The average number of sick days for the non-sworn members was 6.5 sick days per employee. This was down from 2020 by 13%.

#### **Commendations:**

3 commendations were given out in 2021 to the following Officers:

To: Sergeant Charles LaRue, Corporal Matt Nero, Officer Richard Michaels.

The above officers were dispatched to an ambulance assist at a business within Coolbaugh Township on May 7, 2021. Upon arrival, officers discovered that an adult male had sustained a catastrophic laceration to his arm from a broken mirror. The patient was losing significant amounts of blood and was losing consciousness. Officer immediately applied a tourniquet which stopped blood loss. Officers then established a landing zone for med-evac transport, however, due to a delay, a decision was made to transport the patient via ambulance. While professional medical providers were treating the patient, Officers provided an escort for the ambulance, assisted in maintaining the tourniquet, and also drove the ambulance to the nearest trauma center. During transport, it was reported that the patient lost signs of life. Upon arrival at the hospital, life saving medical attention was rendered and the patient was stabilized. Had it not been for their quick response, medical intervention, and immediate decision making, this incident would have resulted in the loss of life.

**Higher Education and Veteran Status:** The Pocono Mountain Regional Police has a strong history of hiring officers from diversified background and educational experiences. The Department recognizes the commitment and sacrifice of our veterans and those who have obtained higher educational degrees. #### **Training:**

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department strives to provide as much training as possible, given the responsibilities of a law enforcement organization, in relation to the budget allocation. In 2021, the Department budgeted \$31,750 towards training, \$25,000 towards tuition reimbursement, and \$12,040 towards Act 120 (Police Academy) training expenses. This training allocation is disbursed between department staff to keep up with the ever-increasing responsibilities of initial and continuing education.

All officers are required to attend the Municipal Police Officer Education and Training Commissions (MPOETC) mandatory updates, PMRPD firearms, less lethal, use of force, CPR, First Aid, and mental health trainings. The department takes a practicality approach, in regard to scheduling of virtual and in person, mandatory MPOETC updates. In person updates are conducted at the PMRPD facility and at the Allentown Police Academy. Virtual updates are taken through the PAVTN (Pennsylvania Virtual Training Network).

The department must also maintain required certifications and re-certifications for department trainers. The PMRPD conducts mandatory, in-house, training that takes place throughout the year. While training opportunities were challenging in 2020 due to covid shut downs and restrictions, 2021, saw some return to normalcy for in person training events. The training environment, however, is still in a recovery phase and opportunities are still challenging in some areas and topics. ## Pocono Mountain Regional Police Partnerships

#### Partnership:

#### 1) Pocono Mountain School District - School Resource Officer (SRO) Program

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department currently has 4 SRO's within the Pocono Mountain School District (PMSD). These Officers are currently positioned within 4 main buildings in the district and rotate on occasion.
- PMSD has reimbursed the PMRPD \$404,046.00 for the SRO program in 2021.
- PMSD has reimbursed the PMRPD \$11,782.77 for extra duty assignments.

#### 2) Drug Enforcement Administration Task Force

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continued its partnership with the DEA Task Force in 2021.
- Detective Michael Sciarillo continued as the PMRPD DEA task force representative
- The PMRPD has been reimbursed \$13,597.19 for overtime in 2021.
- The PMRPD has received \$546.00 in asset forfeiture during 2021.

#### 3) Monroe County Drug Task Force

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to participate in the Monroe County Drug Task Force (MCDTF).
- The MCDTF has reimbursed the PMRPD \$84.44 for overtime in 2021.

#### 4) Northeast Pennsylvania Counter Terrorism Task Force (NEPACTTF)

- The PMRPD continues to participate in the NEPACTTF
   The NEPACTTF has purchased various equipment and provided training for PMRPD SWAT Operations.
- The total cost for the equipment and/or training provided by the NEPACTTF for 2021 was \$ 2,769.47.

#### 5) Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation (PMRPF)

- The PMRPD continues to receive support through the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation. In 2021 the PMRPF purchased equipment for and reimbursed the department a total of \$16,056.28, (see pages 103 - 105).

#### **Units of Service:**

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police uses a unit of service concept whereby municipalities purchase a requested number of hours by unit. A unit of service is equal to 10 hours of service. This unit of service is known as a Police Protection Unit or PPU. The 2021 cost per PPU was \$40,994.49. Officer's activity is tracked through the submission of their activity reports. Through the data obtained in these reports, time spent on police activity within our municipalities is broken down and applied to the number of hours requested. This activity is reflected and presented monthly at our police commission meetings.

In 1998, Governor Tom Ridge established the Pennsylvania regional counter terrorism task force system. The Pocono Mountain Regional Police have been active in the Northeast Pennsylvania Counter Terrorism Task Force (NEPACTTF) since the onset. In 2020, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to be an active participant in the NEPACTTF. The NEPACTTF is one of 9 Homeland security task force regions within Pennsylvania. The NEPACTTF provides all hazards planning for the 9 counties within the region. These counties include Monroe, Lehigh, Northampton, Carbon, Pike, Lackawanna, Luzern, Wayne and Susquehanna.

Chief Chris Wagner continues in his role as the Law Enforcement Committee Chairman of the NEPACTTF. The NEPACTTF is funded by grants through the Federal Emergency Management Agency and funneled through the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency. While federal grant funds continue to decrease, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police still benefits from participation in the organization.
