Introduction

To the members of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission (PMRPC), as another year comes to a close, it can be stated that our municipalities and region of Northeast Pennsylvania continue to make great strides in public safety and law enforcement. Our communities are thriving and growing through new businesses and infrastructure. In keeping pace with this growth, our law enforcement services have been stressed, but continue to meet the challenges and respond to the services required.

In 2022, we responded to these challenges by applying for the US Department of Justice COPS grant. Through this application, we were awarded 2, funded, law enforcement officer positions. This grant award will provide an additional 80 hours per week of law enforcement services. In meeting the intent of the COPS grant of furthering the community policing concept, the PMRPD will deploy these 80 hours into areas of our community that will benefit the most from this approach. So, in 2022, we have laid a good foundation of increased services for community safety and law enforcement partnerships in the years to come.

With any successful organization, it is incumbent upon support from the top. It can be said that our elected officials and those appointed to the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission continue to provide incredible support for our men and women in blue. Through this support, morale remains elevated. Elevated morale is crucial and reflected in the overall product provided to our municipalities.

In 2022, Mount Pocono representation changed, while the others remained the same. Tobyhanna, Tunkhannock, Coolbaugh and Barrett Townships maintained their representatives. Mount Pocono Borough replaced Michael Penn and Francis O'Boyle with Randy Altemose and Don Struckle. The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department would like to thank those who served in their capacity as commissioners in 2022.

2022 continued to witness the challenges of effectively and efficiently staffing a law enforcement agency. Nationally and locally, Law Enforcement operations have witnessed an erosion of interest within the profession. On average applicant pools have decreased approximately 50% from past years. The profession has sought ways and methods to combat this

erosion and to find innovative ways to attract qualified applicants to serve our communities. In 2022 the agency had a combination of 2 resignations and 2 retirements. We would like to hereby thank these officers for their service but give a special thanks to retired officers Jeffrey Lutz and William Carey for their outstanding years of service. Through our hiring process, we were able to meet these separations with the addition of 4 new officers. We would like to welcome officers Shane Schneider, Daniel Campagna, Emily Borger, and Michael Cinamella. In addition, the department conducted a search for a new Executive Assistant. In August, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police brought on MaryEllen Sands-Drost. MaryEllen is being trained by Kathy Matisak who will be retiring in 2023.

In looking at the law enforcement operation in 2022, the region experienced it's first drop in both type 1 and type 2 UCR crimes since 2018. Over the last several years, the area has seen a steady decline in Type 1 UCR crimes, while experiencing a steady incline in Type 2 crimes. We are glad to report that in 2022, both statistical categories of crime are on the decline. This is great news for the overall health of our area.

Statistically the region experiences a decrease in most tracked categories. There was an 8% decrease in overall call volume which includes calls for service and motor vehicle crashes. There was also a decrease, across the board, in criminal arrests, traffic arrests, and ordinance arrests. These decreases were reflected in a statistically significant decrease in investigative hours spent by 25%. The decreased hours of investigation time were partially replaced by a 63% increase to training hours that were provided in 2022. Records provided by the Monroe County Control Center, however, still reflect that the Pocono Mountain Regional Police received a county high in number of dispatches. This is the fifth year in a row that the PMRPD has had the high-water mark for county dispatch.

Because of this decrease in overall investigative hours, statistics have reflected that some municipalities which had elevated investigative resources being spent, were leveled by additional patrol time and proactive enforcement within their communities. While criminal justice statistics can be difficult to interpret, what we witnessed in 2022 was a decrease in investigations resulting in an increase training, both coupled with a decrease of both type 1 and type 2 UCR crimes.

To conclude, in 2022, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department experienced a decrease in law enforcement service requests and enforcement actions. This decrease created the opportunity to provide our officers with additional training. The department broke even with personnel by keeping even with separations and on-boarding, but still strives to fill several open positions.

The PMRPD continues in its operational model to provide top notch, professional and accredited law enforcement services to the communities we serve. We provide these services by

adhering to policy and accreditation standards as directed by the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission and guided by the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission. Through these operation guidelines and organizational culture, our men and women have been immersed in best practices and professional law enforcement service. Our officers remain motivated to provide superior law enforcement services with proven results of keeping our communities safe and maintaining law and order. By providing a quality law enforcement service, we foster the health and vibrance of our communities and improve the quality of life for all.





Sick Time:

14 members of the PMRPD used no sick time during 2022. The number of sick days taken during 2022 by all officers was 216 for an average of 5 days per officer. Sick time was up by 43% in 2022 as compared with 2021.

The number of sick days taken for non-sworn employees was 29. The average number of sick days for the non-sworn members was 5.8 sick days per employee. This was down from 2021 by 25%.

Training:

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department strives to provide as much training as possible, given the responsibilities of a law enforcement organization, in relation to the budget allocation. In 2022, the Department budgeted \$31,750 towards training, \$25,000 towards tuition reimbursement, and \$35,120 towards Act 120 (Police Academy) training expenses. This training allocation is disbursed between department staff to keep up with the ever-increasing responsibilities of initial and continuing education.

All officers are required to attend the Municipal Police Officer Education and Training Commissions (MPOETC) mandatory updates, PMRPD firearms, less lethal, use of force, CPR, First Aid, and mental health trainings. The department takes a practicality approach, in regard to scheduling of virtual and in person, mandatory MPOETC updates. In person updates are conducted at the PMRPD facility and at the Allentown Police Academy. Virtual updates are taken through the PAVTN (Pennsylvania Virtual Training Network).

The department must also maintain required certifications and re-certifications for department trainers. The PMRPD conducts mandatory, in-house, training that takes place throughout the year. Pocono Mountain Regional Police Partnerships

Partnership:

1) Pocono Mountain School District - School Resource Officer (SRO) Program

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department currently has 4 SRO's within the Pocono Mountain School District (PMSD). These Officers are currently positioned within 4 main buildings in the district and rotate on occasion.
- PMSD has reimbursed the PMRPD \$421,365.00 for the SRO program in 2022.
- PMSD has reimbursed the PMRPD \$22,624.88 for extra duty assignments.

2) Drug Enforcement Administration Task Force

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continued its partnership with the DEA Task Force in 2022.
- Detective Michael Sciarillo continued as the PMRPD DEA task force representative
- The PMRPD has been reimbursed \$14,708.31 for overtime in 2022.
- The PMRPD has received \$26,902.61 in asset forfeiture during 2022.

3) Monroe County Drug Task Force

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to participate in the Monroe County Drug Task Force (MCDTF).
- The MCDTF has reimbursed the PMRPD \$5,314.08 for overtime in 2022.

4) Northeast Pennsylvania Counter Terrorism Task Force (NEPACTTF)

- The PMRPD continues to participate in the NEPACTTF
 The NEPACTTF has purchased various equipment and provided training for PMRPD SWAT Operations.
- Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation (PMRPF)
- The PMRPD continues to receive support through the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation. In 2022 the PMRPF purchased equipment for and reimbursed the department a total of \$13,775.46 (see pages 103 105).

5) Attorney General

The PMRPD participates in special investigations in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Attorney General's Office (PAOAG). In 2022, the PMRPD was reimbursed \$4,132.74 in overtime expenses.

Units of Service:

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police uses a unit of service concept whereby municipalities purchase a requested number of hours by unit. A unit of service is equal to 10 hours of service. This unit of service is known as a Police Protection Unit or PPU. The 2022 cost per PPU was \$42,137.54. Officer's activity is tracked through the submission of their activity reports. Through the data obtained in these reports, time spent on police activity within our municipalities is broken down and applied to the number of hours requested. This activity is reflected and presented monthly at our police commission meetings.

Pocono Mountain Regional Police Assigned Time Breakdown







In 1998, Governor Tom Ridge established the Pennsylvania regional counter terrorism task force system. The Pocono Mountain Regional Police have been active in the Northeast Pennsylvania Counter Terrorism Task Force (NEPACTTF) since the onset. In 2022, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to be an active participant in the NEPACTTF. The NEPACTTF is one of 9 Homeland security task force regions within Pennsylvania. The NEPACTTF provides all hazards planning for the 9 counties within the region. These counties include Monroe, Lehigh, Northampton, Carbon, Pike, Lackawanna, Luzern, Wayne and Susquehanna.

Chief Chris Wagner continues in his role as the Law Enforcement Committee Chairman of the NEPACTTF. The NEPACTTF is funded by grants through the Federal Emergency Management Agency and funneled through the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency. While federal grant funds continue to decrease, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police still benefits from participation in the organization. In 2022, the NEPACTTF continued to provide equipment and training for the officers of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police.
