#### Introduction

To the members of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission and the residents of Tobyhanna Township, Tunkhannock Township, Coolbaugh Township, Barrett Township, and Mount Pocono Borough. I would like to take this opportunity to inform you of the state of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department, the state of law and order, and the safety of our communities for the year of 2023.

Nationwide, hiring and retention within the law enforcement profession has been challenging. The agency has made some strides towards filling both sworn and non-sworn openings within the department. During 2023, the department enacted and adjusted our hiring and retention strategies to include hiring and retention bonuses for sworn positions. These bonuses were funded through a combination of the agency budget and grant funding. The agency also allocated additional funds towards advertising and used additional advertising formats. Department personnel were also instrumental in going out into the community to promote the agency and the benefits of being a law enforcement officer. The results of this effort found an increase in overall applicants to the agency, however the challenges for the profession remain.

What we did see within the agency staffing was two non-sworn retirements and one nonsworn resignation. For sworn staff, there was a single resignation. The agency did on-board 4 sworn officers in 2023 and two non-sworn personnel. We would like to recognize the retirement of Executive Assistant Kathy Matisak and Data Entry Clerk Laura Deane for their years of dedicated and excellent service for the department. We would also like to recognize the hiring of Officers Michael Sebastianelli, Cody Peters, Ryan Thomas, and Adam Bond to the force. Finally, we would like to recognize Data Entry Clerk Molly O'Connor as starting in 2023.

In 2023, the agency was able to fill the two Department of Justice COPS grant positions which enabled the Regional Department to add an additional 80 hours per week of Law Enforcement service. As part of the COPS grant, the 80 hours is dedicated towards the mission of community policing. We have deployed these additional 80 hours directly into our residential communities and businesses in the form of specialized patrols. While we continue to analyze data, there are initial signs that these directed patrols have decreased crime and elevated community satisfaction within those areas.

In 2023, the department was officially awarded \$1,473,993 for the Local Law Enforcement grant, funded through the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD). The grant application was funded by the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation. The grant request and subsequent approval focused on several separate, but intertwined projects. The first project was to build the foundation for other aspects of this grant by upgrading our information technology (IT) infrastructure. Specifically, we sought to adjust, increase capacity, and better control our data storage. As part of the IT project, we have started the process of upgrading our records management system from CODY Systems to the new CODY Pathfinder, which is cloud based.

Second, we requested funding to upgrade the information technology within our patrol fleet. Specifically, we requested funds to upgrade our mobile data terminals, our mobile video and audio recording units, upgrade our mobile radios to the new P25 systems, and incorporate a License Plate Reader system. This aspect of the project will equip our patrol cars with the latest information technology and sustain the fleet for several years into the future.

The next project was to implement a body worn camera system. This project required the agency to update and adjust our current policy on Mobile Audio and Video Recordings policy, so that it would pass both accreditation standards and PCCD requirements. Once this was completed, the project required us to upgrade the current car cameras to the new Watchguard M500 system. This system now integrates both the car cameras and the body worn cameras into a singular software system. The body worn camera system was not ready for implementation in 2023, but is expected to be operational in early 2024.

The next project was to acquire, train and deploy a Leica Forensic Laser Scanner. The laser scanner is utilized to diagram and document crime and crash scenes. The laser scanner measures and diagrams these scenes within minutes rather than the customary hours that it would take to reconstruct these scenes in the past. In 2023, the forensic scanner was received, officers were trained and the scanner had its first deployment.

Another portion of the IT project was to upgrade communications equipment for our Special Weapons and Tactics team. This procurement is still in progress and has not been completed as of year end 2023. Finally, as previously mentioned, we received funding to provide for hiring and retention bonuses.

As customary in this report, I would like to, again, recognize the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission. The key to the success of any organization is sound, practical leadership that provides the support necessary to carry out the operation. As the PMRPC are comprised of volunteers, a good amount of trust is required in the leadership and staff of the Pocono Mountain

Regional Police Department. We recognize that trust and, at the same time, provide the PMRPC with feedback and monthly reports on the agency's activities, requests, and visions for the future. This support and interaction has generated an incredible working relationship that has continued to foster high moral within the agency. It can be said that a happy work force is an efficient work force. In 2023, there was a single change to the municipal representation. Coolbaugh Township replaced Commissioner Anthony LaMantia with Tracy Fox. I would like to thank Commissioner LaMantia for his service.

In evaluating the health of our communities in relation to law enforcement activity, our communities remain healthy. While we did see our first increase in Type 1 UCR crime, this was our first increase in Type 1 crimes in 10 years. The increase is mainly driven by the elevation in theft complaints. Thefts increased by 74 incidents from 2022 to 2023. We also saw our homicides double from 3 to 7. This increase is driven by the national struggle with opioid addiction and Drug Deliveries Resulting in Death investigations. So, in analyzing our Type 1 increase, it is mainly driven by non-violent offenses while also accounting for crimes that are not unique to our communities.

Outside of our crime reporting, our area experienced decreases in calls for service and increases in enforcement activity. Complaints dropped by 4 percent, and crashes dropped by 13%. At the same time, Criminal arrests increased by 7%, traffic enforcement increased by 26%, and ordinance enforcement increased by 85%. The department also saw a continued decrease in time spent investigating crime and a subsequent increase in proactive patrol time. While law enforcement statistics can be difficult to interpret, we can say that, in the same year, we saw proactive patrol time and enforcement increase while complaints, time spent investigating crime, and crashes decreased.

Due to the decrease in calls for service, for the first time in the last 6 years, the department was not the lead in recorded dispatches from the Monroe County Control Center. The department also witnessed a continued climb in training hours to over 10,000 hours. This is largely driven, however, by 4 cadets in the police academy for the required Act 120, 919 hours.

In conclusion, in 2023, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police was able to meet the nationwide challenges of hiring and retention. The agency secured and implemented grant funding that put additional police officers on the streets and equipped them with cutting edge technology. The additional personnel and technology is an integral part of keeping our communities safe and healthy. We witnessed an increase in enforcement activity and subsequent decrease in calls for service. While there was an elevation in Type 1 UCR crime, this was the first increase in over 10 years and driven by non-violent theft complaints. Type 2 crimes bucked the trend of yearly increases and fell effectively cancelling the Type 1 increases for all intents and purposes.

The PMRPD continues in its operational model to provide top notch, professional and accredited law enforcement services to the communities we serve. We provide these services by adhering to policy and accreditation standards as directed by the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission and guided by the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Commission. Through these operation guidelines and organizational culture, our men and women have been immersed in best practices and professional law enforcement service. Our officers remain motivated to provide superior law enforcement services with proven results of keeping our communities safe and maintaining law and order. By providing a quality law enforcement service, we foster the health and vibrance of our communities and improve the quality of life for all.





#### Sick Time:

10 members of the PMRPD used no sick time during 2023. The number of sick days taken during 2023 by all officers was 159 for an average of 3.53 days per officer. Sick time was down by 30% in 2023 as compared with 2022.

The number of sick days taken for non-sworn employees was 23. The average number of sick days for the non-sworn members was 3.9 sick days per employee. This was down from 2022 by 23%.

#### <u>Training:</u>

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department strives to provide as much training as possible, given the responsibilities of a law enforcement organization, in relation to the budget allocation. In 2023, the Department budgeted \$32,500 towards training, \$25,000 towards tuition reimbursement, and \$36,120 towards Act 120 (Police Academy) training expenses. This training allocation is disbursed between department staff to keep up with the ever-increasing responsibilities of initial and continuing education.

All officers are required to attend the Municipal Police Officer Education and Training Commissions (MPOETC) mandatory updates, PMRPD firearms, less lethal, use of force, arrest restraint tactics, CPR, First Aid, and mental health trainings. The department takes a practicality approach, in regard to scheduling of virtual and in person, mandatory MPOETC updates. In person updates are conducted at the PMRPD facility and at the Allentown Police Academy. Virtual updates are taken through the PAVTN (Pennsylvania Virtual Training Network).

The department must also maintain required certifications and re-certifications for department trainers. The PMRPD conducts mandatory, in-house, training that takes place throughout the year. ### Pocono Mountain Regional Police Partnerships

Partnership:

#### 1) Pocono Mountain School District – School Resource Officer (SRO) Program

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police Department currently has 4 SRO's within the Pocono Mountain School District (PMSD). These Officers are currently positioned within 4 main buildings in the district and rotate on occasion.
- PMSD has reimbursed the PMRPD \$444,238.00 for the SRO program in 2023.
- PMSD has reimbursed the PMRPD \$30.852.13 for extra duty assignments.

#### 2) Drug Enforcement Administration Task Force

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continued its partnership with the DEA Task Force in 2023.
- Detective Michael Sciarillo continued as the PMRPD DEA task force representative
- The PMRPD has been reimbursed \$19,342.60 for overtime in 2023.
- The PMRPD has received \$65,128.55 in asset forfeiture during 2023.

#### 3) Monroe County Drug Task Force

- The Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to participate in the Monroe County Drug Task Force (MCDTF).
- The MCDTF has reimbursed the PMRPD \$12,673.35 for overtime in 2023.

#### 4) Northeast Pennsylvania Counter Terrorism Task Force (NEPACTTF)

- The PMRPD continues to participate in the NEPACTTF The NEPACTTF has purchased various equipment and provided training for PMRPD SWAT Operations.
- Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation (PMRPF)
- The PMRPD continues to receive support through the Pocono Mountain Regional Police Foundation. In 2023 the PMRPF purchased equipment for and reimbursed the department a total of \$40,255.54 (see pages 110 112).

#### 5) Attorney General

- The PMRPD participates in special investigations in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Attorney General's Office (PAOAG). In 2023, the PMRPD was reimbursed \$0 in overtime expenses due to no PAOAG and PMRPD special investigations.

#### **Units of Service**:

The Pocono Mountain Regional Police uses a unit of service concept whereby municipalities purchase a requested number of hours by unit. A unit of service is equal to 10 hours of service. This unit of service is known as a Police Protection Unit or PPU. The 2023 cost per PPU was \$47,503.19. Officer's activity is tracked through the submission of their activity reports. Through the data obtained in these reports, time spent on police activity within our municipalities is broken down and applied to the number of hours requested. This activity is reflected and presented monthly at our police commission meetings.




## Pocono Mountain Regional Police Assigned Time Breakdown

In 1998, Governor Tom Ridge established the Pennsylvania regional counter terrorism task force system. The Pocono Mountain Regional Police have been active in the Northeast Pennsylvania Counter Terrorism Task Force (NEPACTTF) since the onset. In 2023, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police continues to be an active participant in the NEPACTTF. The NEPACTTF is one of 9 Homeland security task force regions within Pennsylvania. The NEPACTTF provides all hazards planning for the 9 counties within the region. These counties include Monroe, Lehigh, Northampton, Carbon, Pike, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Wayne and Susquehanna.

Chief Chris Wagner continues in his role as the Law Enforcement Committee Chairman of the NEPACTTF. The NEPACTTF is funded by grants through the Federal Emergency Management Agency and funneled through the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency. While federal grant funds continue to decrease, the Pocono Mountain Regional Police still benefits from participation in the organization. In 2023, the NEPACTTF continued to provide equipment and training for the officers of the Pocono Mountain Regional Police.
